## The Story of OATS

Tom Kamber and a group of volunteers launch OATS in NYC to help seniors learn and use technology to live better in the digital age



2013

OATS teaches 10,000 class sessions at over 70 partner sites + 30 new computer labs in NYC

Launch of the Senior Planet Exploration Center in Manhattan— America's first technology-themed community center for older adults.



Expands programs outside of NYC to Plattsburgh, New York, and partners with local sponsors in Maryland, Florida and California.

### **OATS** Timeline

2020

Foundation grants of more than \$3M help expand Senior Planet to Texas and Colorado.



2021: OATS became a charitable affiliate of AARP, leading to increased reach and impact of partnerships and training.



2024: Work with even more AARP State office to bring inperson and virtual Senior Planet classes to AARP members across the country.



2023

**AGING**connected

2020: \$3M grant from the Humana Foundation helps launch Aging Connected, a national campaign to bridge the digital divide.




2023: Expanded licensing program to offer Senior Planet programs at over 400 licensed sites across 30 states. Opened a new Senior Planet center in Miami!

expertise value scale





### Rideshare Classes

Senior Planet's class on ride sharing apps covers the two most popular apps, Uber and Lyft, and the pros and cons of them both.

# Why Ridesharing?

- Reliable, on-demand, and convenient
- Help older adults maintain independence
- Provide safety features for riders and family members (tracking, cashless payments, etc.)



## The Root of Resistance

- Lack of knowledge and access to information
- Anxiety around breaking tech
- Trust and safety concerns





# Transportation Options

#### **Requiring Tech:**

- Uber allows riders to request accessible vehicles
- Lyft Silver is a service launched specifically for older adults

#### Traditional, non-tech:

- Access-a-Ride is a more traditional medical transportation option
- Medicaid non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) is a benefit for transportation to medical appointments





## New Class: Lyft Silver

Senior Planet will soon be launching a class about Lyft Silver. The service is designed for older adults and offers:

- Ride more often in cars that are easy to get in and out of
- User-friendly app
- Live phone support is available from 8 AM–9 PM ET to help riders over the phone
- Trusted contacts can see ride location details in real time









## Aging Without Access

OATS latest report shows that nearly 1/3 of Americans 65+ remain disconnected, limiting access to essential healthcare, government services, and opportunities for social connection.



19 million older adults lack wireline broadband at home, dropping from 22 million in 2018.



Computer ownership is up, especially among adults 75+ with 67% owning larger screen computers like desktops and laptops.



Cellular connectivity is gaining ground, with 7 million more older adults gaining cellular connectivity since 2018.









