Micro-Mobility

A range of small, lightweight vehicles driven by users personally; includes bikes, scooters, mopeds



Rideshare

A practice in which a driver offers rides to other passengers, often for a fee through a website or app



Circulator

A short-distance, circular, fixed-route transit mode that takes riders around a specific area with major destinations.



Active Transportation

Human powered transportation including walking, biking, and rolling.



Personal Vehicle

A car; the most common form of transportation in the US



NEMT

A service for people who need transportation to/from medical appointments; often covered by Medicaid



Fixed Route Transit

A system of buses, vans, trolleys that follow a set schedule and route; ADA equivalent is called ParaTransit

A Continuum of Transportation Options is Needed



5 As of Age-Friendly Transportation



Availability

Ensuring transportation options are available when and where older adults need them, including flexible schedules and routes



Accessibility

Making the service easy to use with features like wheelchair ramps, door-to-door assistance, clear signage, etc.



Acceptability

Creating an environment that feels comfortable, safe, and welcoming



Adaptability

Offering flexible options that can adjust to the changing needs of older adults, like a deviated fixed route service



Affordability

Ensuring options are financially accessible for older adults










Accessible and Inclusive Transit Stops

- 3) proximity of stops and routes to areas of interest
- 4) additional training on using transit
